WEST PALM BEACH, FLORIDA: When Henry Morrison Flagler, one of the original developers of South Florida, first visited the area in 1893, he exclaimed: "It's a veritable paradise." Flagler laid out his grand plan for the city and named many of the streets for native plants including banyan, myrtle, and poinsettia (now Dixie Highway).

After several booms and busts, West Palm exploded into a new era of progress with an influx of veterans relocating after World War II. It was the fourth fastest growing metropolitan in the United States during the 1950s.

The Club at Ibis, one of West Palm's well regarded private communities, is almost a small town in itself.
