COLORADO SPRINGS, COLORADO: The Heritage Hallway, documenting a century of golf at The Broadmoor, was a highlight for guests in attendance for the just concluded 2018 U.S. Senior Open held at the resort.

"It's easy to spend an hour touring the exhibits and memorabilia," said Russ Miller, director of golf.

There are rare golf clubs from a bygone era on display, including several Nicklaus drivers and clubs Donald Ross played in 1918.

"It's fascinating to see how technology has advanced in golf club manufacturing over the generations," continued Miller. "When I look at Donald Ross's irons, I can't help but think 'how in the heck can you hit these.' Even the type of driver Nicklaus used to win the 1959 U.S. Amateur at the Broadmoor looks archaic."

A GREAT STORY TO TELL

Heritage Hallway also pays tribute to several personalities with a longtime connection to the resort. "One display pays homage to Dow Finsterwald, the former director of golf for 28 years, who notched 11 PGA TOUR wins and played on four Ryder Cup teams," described Miller.

The Broadmoor has a long history of supporting women's golf including the 2011 U.S. Women's Open. "Incredibly, Judy Bell, Barbara McIntire, Tish Preuss, and Nancy Syms have called The Broadmoor home," said Miller.

The Broadmoor offers two championship courses, multiple pools, 24 retail outlets, a luxurious spa, 20 dining establishments, and 185,000 square feet of meeting space. The resort's main campus has 784 opulent guest rooms, suites, and cottages.
