STREAMSONG, FLORIDA: Since Streamsong stormed the golf scene six years ago, the resort has received over 70 major industry awards for its facilities. "Our bass fishing, sporting clays, and archery expeditions are growing in scale and popularity," said Mogensen. "You might be surprised to learn our resort's non-golf activity revenue is about evenly split with our golf income. The modern convention space coupled with our long list of outside activities provides an outlet for corporate meetings. Last year, more than 400 groups experienced our warm hospitality."

STREAMSONG RESORT sits on 16,000 acres of formally mined land. During extraction, 15 million cubic yards of sand was stockpiled. For the better part of six decades the sand sat dormant, buffered by wind and rainstorms. With no development surrounding the courses, you hear nothing except for elements of weather, wildlife, and native grasses swaying in the breeze.
