



## LAS CAMPANAS Where Life Outdoors Comes Naturally

SANTA FE, NEW MEXICO: The word *bluebird* symbolizes two meanings that both crystalize the Las Campanas lifestyle. Its most common definition refers to a cloudless sky with calm conditions, while the other references Native American culture and stands as a sign of prosperity and happiness.

"As a Certified Audubon Golf Facility, water conservation and habitat preservation are the important ethos among members and management," expressed Isabel Chavarria, director of membership at Las Campanas. "Our Bluebird

Trail features 65 bird boxes to help propagate birdlife. It has been so well received that over 100 members have enhanced the initiative by installing similar bird boxes in their yards."

Las Campanas features two Jack Nicklaus Signature golf courses, a tennis pavilion, an industry leading fitness center with indoor/outdoor swimming pools, a highly acclaimed equestrian program, and a warm and inviting hacienda clubhouse.

"We have tried to stay true to the area's heritage," continued Chavarria. "Our community has genuine Southwestern charm with cultural influences from local Native Americans and descendants of Spanish settlers from nearly 500 years ago. I think a comment from Mr. Nicklaus sums it up best: 'The experience at Las Campanas is very different from other private clubs in the Southwest.' Our architectural guidelines embrace local style with the clubhouse being a shining example of pueblo design with heavy use of traditional stucco, heavy doors, and exposed ceiling beams."

A TRAIL RIDE WITH A WRANGLER
The welfare of horses is paramount at the
20-acre Las Campanas Equestrian Center.
Horses are turned out in large, sandy pad-

docks; fed three times daily; and blanketed and unblanketed as weather necessitates.

"Residents have access to three miles of manicured trails and direct access to 63,000 acres of BLM [Bureau of Land Management] open space," detailed Chavarria. "The size of our equestrian facilities rivals the size of our main clubhouse, showing how important the equine lifestyle is engrained at the club."
