SAVANNAH, GEORGIA: Although golf has been a fixture in America since the late 1800s (Shinnecock Hills in New York opened 12 holes in 1891 and Chicago Golf Club in Illinois opened in 1894), the term "golf community" did not exist in the industry lexicon until the early 1970s.

What today seems to be a natural pairing of real estate on a golf course was an unproven business model when Lee Trevino won the U.S. Open and British Open in a span of three weeks back in 1971.

Two of the early golf community pioneers were Union Camp with its Landings on Skidaway Island development in Georgia and The Lyle Anderson Company which founded Desert Highlands in Arizona. As the years passed, and other golf communities opened, both earned a reputation as best in the country.

THE TRANSITION TO MEMBER OWNED

The Landings Club occupies 4,500-acres of Skidaway Island, about a 25-minute drive from River Street in downtown Savannah. The hallmark of the private community is access to six golf courses designed by Arnold Palmer, Tom Fazio, Arthur Hills, and Willard Byrd.

The key to launching The Landings was accessibility. When a bridge was completed, linking Skidaway Island to the Mainland, construction started in earnest. Ups and downs ensued when the national economy entered a hard recession during the OPEC gas shortage.

Union Camp persevered and the club gained worldwide attention when it received the "Oscar" of real estate honors. The Urban Land Institute Award for Excellence, for the best planned and executed large scale residential community in the nation.

It took 10 years for Union Camp to turn a profit on its significant investment and another decade to sellout real estate before turning the club over to members.

"By any measure, The Landings has been a success," commented Steven Freund, executive director of The Landings Club. "There is a not so funny joke in the golf development world that it's the third developer on a project that makes money. Union Camp was our developer from day one, all promises were delivered, and our club is thriving and stronger than ever."
