Welcome to the Real West

HULETT, WYOMING: Often the naming of a private golf club carries purpose. Monikers commonly refer to their location, the architect who designed the course, or are inspirational and whimsical in nature.

The naming of The Golf Club at Devils Tower has an interesting history behind it. The club pays homage to Devils Tower National Monument, an astounding geological feature protruding out of the prairie of the Black Hills that was declared the first National Monument in 1906 by President Theodore Roosevelt.

Bunkers are rough around the edges and fairways are framed by native grasses. The front plays through an open prairie and the back nine has more trees and elevation changes. The trio of holes 11, 12, and 13 play to the canyon rim with clear views of Devils Tower in the distance. “We were honored to be chosen by *Golfweek* as one of the top private courses in the state of Wyoming,” continued Johnson.

“On the social calendar, our Turkey Shoot is a little different than what you would experience at a private club in Scottsdale,” grinned Johnson. “Our region offers an ideal setting for elk and mule deer hunting. Or, enjoy fishing for trout, walleye, catfish, and bass.” ■

A 5,500-footlong runway is just up the street from the clubhouse. You can be from tarmac to tee in 10 minutes.

The club has a ranch-to-table partnership with Durham Ranch in nearby Wright, Wyoming (one of the largest bison ranches in North America).



The 1895 antique Red Birch backbar in the clubhouse was discovered at The Cowboy Bar in Belle Fourche, South Dakota. The ice box (electricity was not available) stored bottles of beer on their sides. Why? In the early 1900s, beer bottles were sealed with cork and a foil wrap. Laying a bottle on its side prevented the cork from drying out. Budweiser invented the first metal star cap to replace cork. Whiskey flights, wine, craft beer on tap and more are ready to be served.
