The goals of the Kohanaiki golf program are two-fold: first, to offer members once-in-a-lifetime chances to play with (and against) internationally renowned pros on 18 holes of pure challenge, and second, to treat everyone to an experience that's just pure, unabashed fun. From the vantage point of the beautiful tee boxes or oceanfront holes to the always-on mai tai and margarita fountains of good cheer, our golf is a good walk, with (and without) footwear.

It's also a mindful 18 holes. The stunning emerald of the course winds through the rich black of ancient lava flows, and around 14 *Ahu*, the ancient rock shrines that helped travelers find their way long, long ago. Two hundred ancient anchialine ponds on the land- former fishing waters- are today home to native and migratory birds and wildlife.



We've endeavored to ensure that the maintenance of the course doesn't compromise the rest of our beloved environment. The Audubon Society Signature Sanctuary is a measurable step in that direction: we engaged in environmental planning, created a resource management plan for wildlife, habitat, waste, energy, water quality and conservation, pest management and chemical storage and uses. A site-specific Natural Resource Management Plan ensures that stewardship is practiced over the long term, and we continue to earn the trust and confidence of the Audubon Society.
