The same year Cabbage Patch dolls took the world by storm, and a first-class U.S. postage stamp was \$0.20, Nicklaus made his mark on the desert landscape.

SCOTTSDALE, ARIZONA: Desert Highlands, celebrating its 40th anniversary, has long held its place in golf history as host of the inaugural PGA Skins Game in 1983. The format became one of the most successful made-for-television franchises in all of sports, with four of golf's biggest names (Gary Player, Arnold Palmer, Jack Nicklaus, and Tom Watson) competing in a go-for-broke format over two days during Thanksgiving weekend when golf traditionally was dark, college football was limited, and even the NFL had two fewer games to compete against.

Player won the event with seven skins worth \$170,000. Palmer finished second with eight skins worth \$140,000.

Nicklaus and Watson finished third and fourth, respectively. Player's skin win on the 17th hole (worth \$150,000) represented more money at the time than he had won in a single year on the PGA TOUR.

"By the third year of the PGA Skins Game, every homesite was spoken for," explained Joan Sykora, director of sales at Desert Highlands. "The competition quickly placed our community on the map."
