OUTSIDE ASHEVILLE, NORTH CAROLINA: Balsam Mountain Preserve is roughly 50 times the size of Central Park in New York City. On an annual basis, 42 million guests stroll through Central Park, while the upscale lifestyle at Balsam Mountain Preserve is reserved for just 354 families. Residents at Balsam are more likely to see fourlegged friends out their windows than people.

The Balsam property, comprised of over 4,400 acres of pristine mountain wilderness, is the lowest-density gated community in all the Carolinas. "Getting away from it all" is as easy as coming home, while at the same time, the community offers a wide range of world-class, resort-style amenities for residents, their families, and friends to enjoy whenever they wish.

In reverence to its surroundings, the exclusive community has established the Balsam Mountain Trust, under which 3,200 acres have been set aside as permanent conservation land, providing access to nature in its most unspoiled form to Balsam residents. and one way out unless you arrive by helicopter," continued Southworth. "Few, if any, private communities can match our breadth and elbow room. We go to great lengths to groom the 44 miles of trails that crisscross our wilderness ridges."

Balsam Mountain Preserve lies just off the Great Smoky Mountain Expressway, 40 miles southwest of Asheville. In addition to its acclaimed Arnold Palmer Signature Golf Course, membership privileges include a first-class equestrian center and access to eight miles of Class A wild trout streams. "We are nirvana for fly fisher-

> men," added Southworth. "The trout are healthy and powerful since water flow to the river is not artificially generated or controlled."

A HIGHER STANDARD

"Our elevation ranges from 3,000 to 5,500 feet above sea level. So cool mountain tem-

peratures make summer horseback rides or afternoon tee times pleasant and comfortable," said Southworth. "One of my favorite quotes epitomizing Balsam Mountain Preserve is, 'One can sit in a car and see what man has made. One can sit on the back of a horse and see what God has made.'"
