NAYARIT, MEXICO (40 minutes north of Puerto Vallarta): Punta Mita has established a reputation known around the world. This fall, the inaugural Mexico Senior Open will be hosted on its Pacifico course.

The name Punta Mita originates from the Aztec word "mictlan" with the literal meaning of "gateway to paradise." I couldn't agree more. The property is surrounded on three sides by nine and one-half (sp 9½) miles of Pacific Ocean—with four beach clubs—and two oceanfront Jack Nicklaus Signature golf courses. To complement the existing St. Regis and Four Seasons resorts, Montage and Pendry hotels are under construction.

Our third iteration of the Punta Mita Pro-Am was a huge success with 11 teams from the Western Hemisphere competing.

The geographic variety of participants added a spice similar to imbibing on a Habanero-infused margarita. Our goal has not wavered since day one to blend competition and camaraderie.

Jean van de Velde, former Ryder Cup competitor, broadcaster, and current Punta Mita ambassador added a bit of celebrity to the weekend. "You haven't experienced authentic Mexico, with a luxury twist, until you visit Punta Mita," expressed Jean. "Cabo San Lucas is considered Southern California's backyard, Cancun excels with all-inclusive trips that fit into a pretty box, while Punta Mita is the way to feel the 'real Mexico.' I've been fortunate to live in 11 countries [from Dubai to the Bahamas] during my professional playing career. I prefer

Punta Mita. Our location offers everything you could wish for except snow skiing. Our Mexico Senior Open this fall is a really big deal. Our mission is to enhance and promote the sport. It's a shared passion among all of us at Punta Mita."

"With over 35 years under my belt as a global hotelier, I landed on these shores 14 years ago and it was love at first sight," said Emberson, head of operations at Punta Mita. "Our destination, a pioneer in the area, is a real melting pot where human interactions count. There are few exclusive private clubs in this neck of the Pacific, where on any given day you can associate with over a dozen nationalities."

OPENING NIGHT WELCOME DINNER

The Pro-Am started on a high note with a family-style meal prepared by the culinary staff at the Kupuri Beach Club for dinner. In addition to an open bar, a special surprise was in store with a sampling of local Raicilla La Reina—a Agave distilled beverage much like Mezcal. The smooth-tasting drink is produced in a region where tequila is known as the king and La Reina is known as the queen.

Day One: Practice Round, Sea Excursion, and Horserace

After a hearty breakfast, our non-golf participants enjoyed an ocean excursion. While they didn't see any whales, dolphins were flocking nearby, and rumor is they caught a couple of fish.

The four-hole Horserace Shootout is always a highly contested competition. This year was no different with 20 two-person, teams competing for 50,000 American Airlines frequent flier miles. "I commend the golf staff

It was a good tournament indeed for Team Riviera Maya and golf professional Ruben Gonzalez for their clean sweep (winning the Horserace Shootout, team Pro-Am, and first place for the golf professional).

"My friendship with my teammates has increased substantially since we started playing golf together," expressed Ruben. "Winning is nice, but giving it your best effort is more important. Placing first in the Pro-Am is a happy accomplishment to be celebrated, but collecting on our side bets and taking money from my best buds is priceless."
