Amenities include the new Tennis Center called The Point, which offers six Har-Tru tennis courts and a pavilion. The new Sports and Wellness Complex, The Plex, offers Colleton members the best in fitness. The state-of-the-art facility opened in September and has a casual dining venue called Palms Café, offering signature

nutritional choices, a large fitness area, pickleball (eight cushioned courts), bocce, and a community pool.

The final gem is the renovation and repurposing of the Dye Clubhouse, which opened in last December. Members can now enjoy an upscale sports bar scene and dine casually on the second floor at the Sandbar overlooking the back of the Dye Course and the Chechessee River. But the views don’t stop there as members can mingle

on the third-floor rooftop lounge before or after dinner cocktails while enjoying the best views in the Lowcountry. Having a community with a rooftop lounge is only one of the many things that make Colleton River Club so extraordinary.
