Before construction started on The View, the parcel of land housed a rustic cabin that Black Rock's golf course superintendent used as his office. "You would be hard-pressed to find better scenery than from his corner office," teased Rasor. "The View is drastically different from our golf clubhouse that features darker hues and heavy wood beams. Now, with two distinctly different options, even on the busiest summer weekends, we don't have a strain on resources."

The View is designed to put families first. "Not only is the building eye-catching, but its wealth of amenities make you feel like a 'kid in a candy store' with a sand volleyball court, pickleball courts, golf simulator, and an outdoor stainless-steel pool. Both teenagers and little ones have areas dedicated specifically to their needs."
