*Seaside golf along the longest private beach in the Carolinas.*

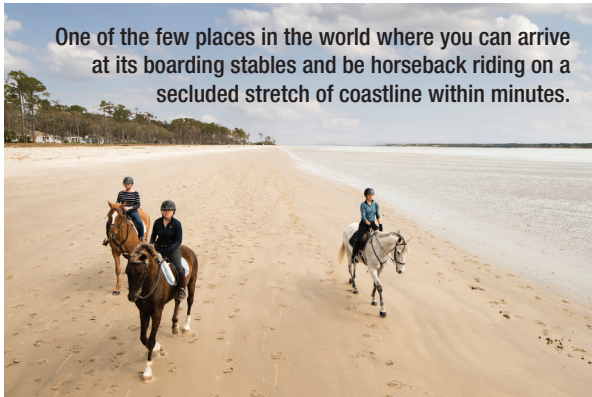

DAUFUSKIE ISLAND, SOUTH CAROLINA (one mile of coast off Hilton Head Island): Within 48 hours of stepping off the ferry, Jody and Vanessa Underhill placed an offer on a residence at Haig Point Club. “I think Vanessa had selected the house before we got off the boat,” smiled Jody. “Living here is a step back in time where neighbors are neighborly, and you can leave your front door unlocked. Ask most Americans who live in a big city, and I doubt they would feel the same way about their community.”

Haig Point is a charming community with a footprint larger than Central Park in New York City, one mile off the coast from the famed Harbour Town Lighthouse. In addition to its Rees Jones designed golf courses, it offers complete equestrian facilities, a beach club, a fitness center, lighted tennis courts, a kids’ camp, a dog park, and one mile of private beach. With no bridge, ferries (running almost hourly) provide transport to the barrier island. Once on the property, members then hop in their golf carts (residents are not allowed to own a gas-powered vehicle).

Jody and Vanessa have a large family with six children and 15 grandchildren. “Little did I know when I met Vanessa at a conference in San Diego what our future held,” recalled Jody.
