CABO SAN LUCAS, MEXICO: When Ken Jowdy, founder and developer of Diamante, first toured the site, the land was nothing but massive sand dunes with ocean views as far as the eye could see. "I was taking a tour of the desert property with the current owner in his Jeep Liberty, and I had to hold on for dear life as we traversed the topography with dunes the size of small buildings," recalled Jowdy.

The first course designed by Davis Love III is appropriately named The Dunes Course. "We pride ourselves in its conditioning and ocean views," continued Jowdy. "When you stand on the 12th green, you can't help but marvel at the vastness of the Pacific Ocean." Instead of cart paths made out of cement, repurposed railroad ties were used to keep a natural look.

Shortly after the grand opening of the Love course, Jowdy's relationship with Tiger Woods started to blossom. "Our business relationship has grown over the past decade," said a pleased Jowdy. "We debuted his first design in the world [El Cardonal] in 2014, followed by his short course The Oasis [that you can literally play barefoot if you wish]."
