HILTON HEAD ISLAND, SOUTH CAROLINA: This year, the PGA TOUR schedule consists of 39 competitions (including FedEx playoff events). Top players are obligated to commit to at least 20 tournaments. So, venues "fight" vigorously to attract the top names in the game. Amid the intense competition, Harbour Town Golf Links at The Sea Pines Resort, is highly regarded by players and ranks their second favorite design—behind Augusta National.

The same year Netflix was founded, we launched Executive Cup. Our original mission was to allow private club champions from around the country the opportunity to compete for national titles. Over the past two decades, our tournament has traveled across 7,000 miles from the shores of Maui to the beaches of Puerto Vallarta and from the lush tropics of Central Florida to the famous floating green in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho. The goal has not wavered since day one—to blend competition and camaraderie



The Sea Pines Resort features three world-class courses: Harbour Town Golf **Links** and **Heron Point**, designed by Pete Dye; and **Atlantic Dunes**, designed by David Love III. Each golf course has a different feel. At Harbour Town Golf **Links**, it's all about ball placement and strategy. If you get "lazy," and aren't proactive in your planning, you will pay the price. Heron Point Golf Course, with its well-positioned directional bunkers, requires your best short game. There is a reason the course is called Heron Point. You can't help but notice the abundance of sea birds. Rounding out the trifecta of golf choices is Atlantic Dunes. It is the 'friendliest" of the trio of courses.

"Our three courses fit together to complete the perfect puzzle for your next golf excursion. Harbour Town is our Mona Lisa. It's a thoughtprovoking design with smaller greens than are typically found on Tour. Bring your patience. You can't overpower the course and it's easy to turn a bogie into a triple in short order. My playing advice: 'Listen to your caddie.'"






EXECUTIVE CUP—INDIVIDUAL PLAY
