

BLACK DIAMOND RANCH A TRIFECTA OF SUCCESS

Where to live if you live for golf.

LECANTO, FLORIDA: In the mid-1940s, John Taylor Jr., a farmer not far from Tampa Bay, Florida, named the property Black Diamond Ranch, after a premium grapefruit of the same name grown in the region. As a side note, grapefruit got its name because of the way it grows in clusters—like grapes. Last season, Florida produced 1.8 million boxes of grapefruit, or about four percent of global production.

“Since we are located in Citrus County, our name rings true,” teased Tim Cole, general manager at Black Diamond

Ranch. “Eventually, the land was developed by Stan Olsen, a New Englander, with 49 holes of Tom Fazio golf. Our topography is atypical for the Sunshine State, with rolling hills and thick vegetation, with few palm trees in sight. If you were dropped on property from a helicopter, you might think you were somewhere in the Carolinas.”

Now owned by Escalante Golf (a boutique owner/operator of luxury golf properties with 25+ properties in its portfolio), Black Diamond Ranch has undergone a renaissance.

“Over the past couple of years, most of our attention was committed to renovations on our golf courses,” said Cole. “Now with our clubhouse receiving a major facelift and the grand opening of the member cottages, we are ready for prime time. The trifecta of pristine playing conditions, a fresh clubhouse interior, and onsite accommodations places Black Diamond Ranch on your short list for consideration.”

During the clubhouse renovation, management had to be creative. “The lobby, Champions Pub, Diamond Room, and Main Dining Room had extensive construction activity,” recalled Cole. “We were able to keep food and beverage operations open, but we faced some challenges. Considering that the majority of work was completed over the summer, hosting functions outside was limited due to the heat, humidity, and ever-present chance of a passing rain shower. So, we converted our boardroom into a dining venue and introduced ‘Chef’s Tableside Experience.’ The culinary staff would prepare meals tableside, including sophisticated desserts like Cherries Jubilee and Bananas Foster. It was so well received that we are continuing the event in our newly renovated Main Dining Room.”
