

LA ROMANA, DOMINICAN REPUBLIC: Pete Dye's father was an insurance salesman, local postmaster, and amateur golf course designer. In 1922, he built a ninehole course, Urbana Country Club in Illinois, where Pete would learn the game at an early age, become a single-digit handicapper, and set the stage for him to become one of golf's most respected golf course architects.

"Most of you know my husband for his signature railroad ties. What you may not know is he always wore a blue shirt on Mondays, was deathly allergic to peanuts, and was forever generous with cash, but never bought presents," recalled Alice Dye, wife of Pete for almost 69 years.

Teeth of the Dog at Casa de Campo Resort (a Pete Dye design hand-carved from a rugged coral landscape in 1970) is the only Caribbean golf course in GOLF Magazine's "Top



Teeth of the Dog will reopen in December after an extensive renovation. "You never want to close your No. 1 resort amenity," said Kycek. "We 'kicked the can' down the road a couple of times to delay its renovation. It was

tough to bite the bullet. But it was the right decision. As we prepare for its reopening, the excitement is building!

"In order to prevent a backlash from golf purists, we hired Jerry Pate [a long-time consultant and friend of Pete] to oversee the improvements. With extensive research and reviewing vintage Kodak photos of each hole, I think we have done an excellent job honoring his legacy."
