We completed an exhaustive search to find the perfect look that replicates some of the great Macdonald and Raynor courses, such as Chicago Golf Club and Sleepy Hollow. In addition, once complete, more than 1,500 new palms and pines will be installed on the perimeter of the property," explained Hull.

"Maintaining this new course also brings the opportunity for our new maintenance center with \$4 million in new equipment. We continue to surprise and challenge our players while also enhancing the enjoyment of the golf experience. Love [and his lead architect Scot Sherman] wanted to provide something unexpected and unique to the local course design options, and this will ensure both playability and a valid test of golf for all

skill levels," offered Hull. ■
