BOCA RATON, FLORIDA: To be named among the “Top-15 Clubs in the World” by Club Leaders Forum requires Boca West Country Club to continually invest in member programming and amenities. After completing its Aquatics Center, part of an ambitious \$70 million project that transformed the Lifestyle Center, attention turned to focus on its four courses and a reimagining of the golf experience.

“Having four courses allows us to phase in improvements so our membership constantly has choices,” commented Matthew Linderman, president/COO and general manager of Boca West Country Club. Boca West has initiated a new \$95 million capital improvement plan. “The first course to be rebuilt is our Palmer 1 Course, which is currently under major construction, and at the same time, we are adding a new 9-hole short course with holes ranging from 75 to 135 yards, along with an 18-hole Himalayan-style putting course.

“We are really excited about these developments, as it is attractive to the golfer looking to work on their short game as well as the social engagement and fun these courses add to our golf-centric community.”

THE DYNAMIC DUO

The team of Dana Fry/Jason Straka has been tasked with the redevelopment of both Palmer courses, the short course, and the 18-hole putting green, along with the eventual reimagining of the club's driving range and short-game practice facilities at Palmer III.



“Their energy level and genuine interest were far superior to all other architects we interviewed,” continued Linderman. “We challenged one another and collaborated for something different than what is typically found in South Florida, and they are delivering on what was promised.”

Over one million cubic yards of earth will be moved during the project. “That equates to more than 83,000 dump trucks!” said Linderman. “When the course opens next season, it will feature the highest elevation in Palm Beach County. Dana and Jason have formed an exceptional partnership—bringing out the best in one another. We cannot wait to open in December of this year to unveil the course to our members.”

AMERICA'S FASTEST-GROWING SPORT

Pickleball has grown by over 170 percent nationally in recent years, but by over 350 percent at Boca West, solidifying its position as the fastest-growing sport in the country. “Tomorrow's members are looking for more than quality golf,” said Linderman. “We listened and have responded by expanding our pickleball club to 25 courses, 12 of which are covered, and hiring a head pickleball pro [a profession that didn't exist that long ago]. Not to be left behind, we also fully rebuilt and modernized our tennis courts. My team is committed to combining outdoor exercise and nutrition to help you lead a healthier life, longer.” ■
